**Additional notes:**

Argentina, Belgium, Chile and the UK have either passed national legislation banning the production of cluster munitions, or the government has made a statement renouncing the production of existing cluster munitions and/or renouncing future production.

The production capacity for cluster munitions no longer exists in the Netherlands. Switzerland states it no longer produces. Neither country has formally renounced future production.

Austria, Belgium and Canada are currently destroying their stockpiles of cluster munitions. Argentina and Honduras have completed the destruction of their stockpiles of cluster munitions.

The Cluster Munition Coalition (CMC) welcomes public statements and information from governments announcing that they have started the process of stockpile destruction and have renounced production.

All countries that have adopted the Convention on Cluster Munitions are expected never to use, produce or transfer cluster munitions in the future and to commence destruction of their stockpiles of cluster munitions as soon as possible.
